Repeating and Joining In

Many books contain repetitions and new details that are gradually introduced. In this book, a different character picks up the onions each time, and the woman carrying the baskets repeats the word “toda” – thank you. This repetition provides toddlers with a sense of security, and allows them to help “tell” the story, engaging them in an active role. You can emphasize the recurring phrases while reading, pause slightly before a new character is introduced, and invite your toddler to join in.

Onions Galore

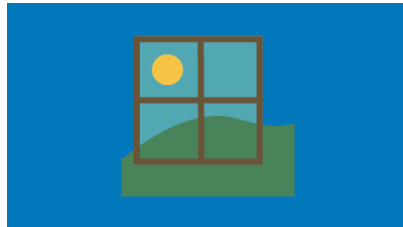
